We get a lot (A LOT) of questions about how new development in the district is affected by construction and new development. Weekly on our social media pages, we share the average water usage across the district as well as the peak water usage day, these numbers can be affected by local weather, seasonal usage trends (like filling swimming pools in the summer!), and even holidays. A longer term look at water usage across multiple years shows a larger view of the shifts within the district that include construction, shifts in the borders of the district, and greater water trends across the state.

While we will get the best look at our 3-year usage trend at the end of the year, above is a snapshot of changes in the size of the district alongside seasonal trends for the months of Jan-August 2022-2024. The overall size of the district based on billed accounts only increased by 12.8% during that time period, while the total water usage in that time increased by only 10.1%.

With the arrival of Autumn, we anticipate usage to begin decreasing in accordance with annual trends, and encourage all of our customers to always practice conservation of our precious resources! Follow us on social media for more conservation tips and updates!

- A first aid kit with prescriptions and medications
- Toiletries
- Drinkable water
- Non-perishable foods and a can opener
- Garbage bags, rubber gloves, and hand sanitizer
- Supplies for children and pets
